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Most air flights, both together foreign as well as local, land on the Henri Coanda International Airport, based out of Otopeni, 22 kilometers northern of city downtown. Henri Coanda flight terminal is actually called Otopeni on the subject of flight reservations, because of the establishment at Otopeni. The airport, built-in 1968, experienced a substantial modernization effort in the late 90's and it is set to get even more enlarged. It is the top link for the Romanian flag airline Tarom and is utilized by the major world-wide airline carriers. All the snack bars inside the terminal transfer (merchants, bars, eating places) may be pricy (everything's about twice costly than in the city). Avoid exchanging cash in the terminal transfer, rates of exchange are actually 20-25% poorer compared to what you can find in the city - you are recommended to utilize visa card at an Cash machine within the lobby for fast requires and trade bucks in the downtown area. You will find a store at the base floor (domestic departure) which is actually a good spot to grab a snack and/or use up the last Lei on departure.

Small Aurel Vlaicu International Airport was used for commercial air flights since the 1920s; this current structure was finalized in 1952 set up on a 1930s blueprint. You'll find it established inside the capital, into Baneasa, around 4-6 kilometers at the capital center and it's used for the most part by business, charter and low-cost flight companies: BlueAir, WizzAir, Germanwings.

Remember that this airport is definitely amazingly modest (only 3 gates), with old features and will be really busy mostly during the charter time of year (June-September as well as December), meant to manage a tenth of the travelers it actually covers. All the driveway and also taxiways had been entirely improved in 2008, and a all new terminal building is being built. Free WI-fi is present (if you're able get a place to sit down and power-up the laptop computer, which is no small task). There's also an ATM machine inside the departures corridor near the Blueair check in but it is not always operating. The exchange desk will have awful rates of exchange. But bear in mind, when you go out of the airport and turn left (towards the city center) you will see some ATM's two blocks on the road. You should buy common public transport tickets at the desk at the bus stop on the other side of the street which runs outside of the airport.

In addition, all kinds of [Cazare Bucuresti](#) can also be found in the neighborhood, which accommodate pretty much all your requirements, this lodgings, motels range from low-priced 2 stars rooms to 4 stars comfortable [Cazare Bucuresti](#), the cost being pretty excellent and finding almost all the services. Dining places and also Shopping Mall are positioned a few minutes driving from the airport terminal, you can have a walk somewhere if the flight is delayed.

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
